Materials Needed

- Cotton T-shirt Material or Cotton Weave Fabric (~1/2 yard will make 2-3 masks) -WASH material to pre-shrink prior to sewing
- All-Purpose Thread
- Preferred -- 23" 1/4" Elastic or Large Elastic Hair Bands (2)
- Material for ties, ties ~ 16" long each
- Scissors, Pins, Sharpie marker
