1. A collection spot
2. Large Container/Bin
3. Signs & Fliers

WHAT TO DO:

- 1) Find a location/Venue
- 2) Place a container (large enough to hold diaper boxes) in designated location.
- 3) Add "Diaper Drive" sign on box or visible in immediate area.

- If you have time, set up a table and chairs and spend time at the diaper drive.
