American Rescue Plan

The landmark legislation includes an additional \$1 billion investment in national service.



AmeriCorps Receives \$1B in Additional Investment


The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 is an unprecedented effort to stop the spread of COVID-19 and respond to the public health, education, and economic crisis caused by the pandemic. It includes measures to deliver immediate relief to American families, fund a national vaccination program, provide aid for small businesses struggling to keep their doors open, cut child poverty in half, reopen schools, and help parents get back to work.

The American Rescue Plan also contains \$1 billion for AmeriCorps and many of its programs, with top line numbers as follows:

- \$620M for AmeriCorps State and National
- \$80M for AmeriCorps VISTA
- \$30M for AmeriCorps Seniors
- \$20M for the Volunteer Generation Fund
- \$20M for State Service Commissions
- \$73M for AmeriCorps Administrative Expenses
- \$148M for the National Service Trust
- \$9M for the Inspector General

This funding will position the agency to make significant, targeted investments to further support the Administration's top priority to provide immediate relief related to the pandemic, with a specific focus on support for underserved and disproportionately impacted communities.

The bill proposes an increase to the AmeriCorps living allowance to make service more accessible and inclusive, increase the diversity, cultural experiences, and number of AmeriCorps members and AmeriCorps Seniors volunteers serving in communities across the country, and to help stabilize existing national service programs and expand into new communities.

Be a driver and make a difference! Project CAR is a non-profit transportation service that provides rides for health appointments, senior care, religious activities, volunteer opportunities, and employment at no cost to the passenger. We network with churches and non-profit agencies through Sioux Falls to give rides for people who would otherwise have no transportation, and we need your help. Become a volunteer driver, giving as little as 2 hours a week driving a safe, comfortable car for our clients. We follow the current CDC guidelines closely, with only one passenger in a car per ride, seated in the back seat, and both the driver and passenger wear a mask.
