The Helpline Center congratulates Loretta Hill on being named the September 2018 Volunteer of the Month, an area-wide award program sponsored by the Helpline Center and MetaBank.

Loretta regularly volunteers with Senior Companions of South Dakota. Loretta provides supportive services that enable adults who need some assistance to maintain independent living. She provides weekly, scheduled visits to individuals living in their homes or apartments. Depending on client needs, Loretta may provide assistance with activities that might include: shopping and errands, light housekeeping, meal planning/preparation/sharing, reading, writing letters, making phone calls, paying bills, completing forms, medication reminders, transportation to doctor appointments and most importantly – conversation, listening and companionship.

Loretta has volunteered over 4,700 hours since October 31, 2012. She received the Gold Presidential Award in 2014 and the Lifetime Presidential Award in 2018. Currently serves 16 hours a week with 6 clients.

One of Loretta's clients shared "Loretta takes me to the grocery store and to an array of appointments. Being 90, I sometimes have a hard time getting around. When we do go out, 1000 N.
